

ANNUAL ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

ECONOMIC AND STATISTICAL ORGANISATION, PUNJAB
2008-2009

Economic and Statistical Organisation acts as the data bank and caters to the statistical needs of the State as well as Central Government, policy makers and research institutions and individual researchers. The Organisation collects primary as well as secondary data at the state, district, block and village level. The data thus collected is compiled, analyzed, interpreted and disseminated through various departmental publications. This Organisation also coordinates statistical activities within the State and keeps proper liaison with Central Statistical Organisation, Government of India.

Economic & Statistical Organisation also undertakes evaluation studies concerning plan programmes /schemes at the instance of State Govt. These reports not only help in formulation of development programmes, but also identify the bottlenecks for taking corrective measures in their implementation.

“Statistical Abstract of Punjab” and “Economic Survey of Punjab” are two widely known annual publications of this Organisation which contain comprehensive data-based information on various socio-economic aspects in the State. Both of these publications are Budget Documents.

Economic & Statistical Organisation is headed by Economic Adviser who is assisted by Directors, Joint Directors, Deputy Economic and Statistical Advisers, Research Officers and Assistant Research Officers.

Economic & Statistical Organisation has 17 regular sections. Besides 4 more sections i.e. MPLAD, TPP, HDRCU & Economic Census are working at the State Head Quarter. One section works for the establishment and the remaining sections are engaged in data -based & research oriented technical work. The establishment section manages the human resource administration and is manned by superintendents, senior assistants, clerks and typists. The Directors, Joint Directors and Deputy Economic and Statistical Advisers provide tips of desired guidance in day to day research work on matters relating to economic and statistical matters. The Research Officers and Assistant Research Officers are mainly responsible for analysis and interpretation of data whereas collection and compilation work is done by Statistical Assistants and Investigators.

There is a District Statistical Office in each district of the State headed by Deputy Economic & Statistical Adviser. With the introduction of decentralized planning, Deputy Economic and Statistical Adviser is fully involved in the formulation and monitoring of the district plan schemes. (A chart showing the administrative set up and distribution of the work of various sections of Organisation is enclosed at the end of the report.)

The activities and the assignments completed by each section/unit during 2008-2009 are given below:-

I. STATE INCOME

This Section prepares estimates of State Domestic Product (SDP) both at current and at constant (1999-2000) prices for all the fifteen sectors of the economy along with per capita income regularly with a time lag of two years. District-wise sectoral estimates of SDP both at current and

constant prices for each year are also prepared. Quick estimates of SDP based on production targets of Agriculture, Livestock, Forestry and Fishing sectors and past trend in respect of other sectors are prepared annually with a time lag of one year. Sector wise growth rates of SDP for different periods are prepared to study the trend of economy. In addition to it, notes on economic situation in the state and comparative position of the states' vis-à-vis other states with respect to State Domestic Product are prepared for the use of State Government.

Work done during 2008-2009

1. The following estimates of SDP at current and constant (1999-2000) prices were prepared for all the fifteen sectors of the economy.
 - a) Estimates of Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) and Net State Domestic Product (NSDP) for the year 2006-07.
 - b) Quick estimates of GSDP and NSDP for the year 2007-2008.
 - c) Advance Estimates of GSDP and NSDP for the year 2008-09
2. District-wise State Income estimates for the year 1999-2000 to 2005-06 at current and constant (1999-2000) prices.
3. Information regarding economic situation and growth rates were prepared for inclusion in budget speech of Finance Minister, Punjab and for Governor's address in Budget Session of Punjab.
4. Following data was sent to Central Statistical Organisation, Govt. of India, New Delhi.
 - a) Comparable sector wise data on State Domestic Product for the year 2005-06 to 2006-07 at current & constant prices.
 - b) Data relating to employment and compensation of employees of Municipal Committees/Corporations under Water Supply sector.
 - d) Information regarding slaughtered animals of Livestock sector for the year 2006-07.
 - d) Production and price for Fishery and Forestry sector for the year 2006-07.
 - e) Information regarding production, prices and area under agriculture and horticulture crops for agriculture sector number of tractors and number of diesel engines in Punjab for the year 2006-07.
5. Two workshops were attended as below.

II. PUBLIC FINANCE

This section undertakes economic analysis of State Govt. budget and budgets of Municipal Corporations/Councils and Nagar Panchayats. Macro economic data regarding Public Finance is maintained and supplied for various uses.

Work done during 2008-2009

1. Economic & Functional Classification of Municipal Budget to study the impact of the budgetary transactions of all the Municipal Corporations in the State for the year 2006-07 was prepared and got approved from the competent authority.
2. Publication, Statistics of “Public Finance Punjab” (relates to comparative study of revenue receipts and revenue expenditure of all the states in India) for the year 2006-07 was prepared and got approved from the competent authority .
3. Economic & purpose classification of Punjab Govt. Budget for the year 2007-08 was prepared and got approved.

III. CAPITAL FORMATION

This section prepares estimates of Gross State Domestic Capital Formation for all the 13 sectors of the economy at current as well as at constant (1999-2000) prices both for public and private sectors. These estimates were compiled asset wise, institution wise and industry wise for the state as a whole.

Work done during 2008-2009:-

1. Estimates of Gross State Domestic Capital Formation for the year 2005-06 at current and constant (1999-2000) prices were prepared by type of assets and by type of institution for all (13) Sectors of the economy.
2. Four tables relating to the estimates of Gross State Domestic Capital Formation were prepared and sent to the Compilation Section to be got published in the State Statistical Abstract, 2008.
3. Information relating to Critical Indicators for the year 2005-06 has been prepared and sent to Field Operation Section.

IV. EMPLOYMENT

The Advisory Committee of Economists set up by the Planning Commission to examine the recommendations of Dantawala Committee of experts recommended that suitable surveys and studies be undertaken in the field of employment and man power. Keeping in view the above, the Punjab Govt. established an employment cell in Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab for conducting the studies under the schemes “Impact on Employment in Command Areas of Industrial and Power Projects and spread its effect on the Employment in the adjoining areas.” The Employment section has conducted twelve studies so far. But due to shortage of staff no study can be taken up during 2008-09.

Work done during 2008-2009

On the basis of information received from Department of Food, Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs Punjab and the Department of Employment Generation & Training Punjab, the two chapters ‘Employment’ and ‘Public distribution system’ were prepared for their inclusion in Economic Survey 2008-09. Two tables each regarding retail rates charged by the fair price shops, distribution of essential commodities and employment in the organized sector, number of job seekers

on the live register of employment exchanges were prepared and sent to concerned section for its inclusion in Economic Survey 2008-09.

V. INDUSTRIAL STATISTICS

This section was set up in 1967-68 in E.S.O. with the objective of collection and compilation of industrial statistics in the State. Presently the compilation of Quarterly/Annually Index of Industrial Production (IIP) for selected important items and the preparation of District-wise summary results for some key parameters on the industries in the state are the main function of this section.

On the recommendations of CSO (Govt. of India) this section has been compiling State Level Index of Industrial Production (IIP) annually as well as quarterly with base year 1993-94=100. For this purpose a number of 904 Industrial Units/factories were selected for 111 items including Electricity and Sulphar. Information for this purpose is being collected from the offices of General Managers of Industries at District level

Work done during 2008-2009

- 1 .State quarterwise and Annual Index of Industrial Production (IIP)was prepared for the year 2007-08 (P) with base year 1993-94=100 for the selected 111 items at two digit level of NIC-1987 on the basis of 596 responding units were prepared.
2. Apart from above the information for the revision of base year for IIP from 1993-94 to 1999-2000 was prepared at Division level, 2-digit level, 3-digit level and item level Weighting Diagram and sought approved from CSO MOSPI Govt. of India to start work according.

VI. PLAN EVALUATION

This section was set up in the Economic and Statistical Organisation, Punjab in 1964. The evaluation section is engaged in evaluating various programmes/ schemes being implemented by various departments. These reports are helpful to the planners and administrators in formulating the schemes/programmes which help in taking the corrective measures for removing the bottlenecks. Besides this section undertakes con-current/ quick evaluation of different development schemes. Since its inception this section has conducted 173 evaluation studies.

Work done during 2008-2009

1. Work in respect of field survey in selected five districts regarding evaluation study on Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Project was completed.
2. Counter comments on comments received from concerned department regarding report on Apprenticeship Training Scheme were prepared.
3. The technical note and schedules prepared for conducting evaluation study on Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Project was got approved from Technical Sub-Committee
4. The work regarding compilation of information collected during the field survey in respect of evaluation study on Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Project was completed and tabulation remained under progress. The work regarding report writing was also taken in hand.

VII. COMPILATION

Compilation section acts as data bank in the department. Wide range of data is made available comprehensively to the State Administrators, Planners and Researchers so as to take important decisions in formulating and implementing the departmental schemes and for undertaking research

work in the State. Statistical Abstract (Budget Document), Annual Administrative Report and Punjab at Glance are prepared. This section also coordinates statistical activities with Govt. of India and various states.

Work done during 2008-2009

1. Twenty one chapters of Statistical Abstract of Punjab 2008 were prepared and got computerized.
2. Material for the Chief Minister's, Governor's and Finance's Minister's address for the budget session 2009 was prepared and supplied.
3. Information on the achievements of the department during the year was sent to CM office.
4. Annual Administrative Reports for the year 2006-07 was prepared and got approved in the Council of Ministers Meeting (CMM). Annual Administrative Reports for the year 2007-2008 was prepared and got approved. Memorandum was sent to Hon'ble Finance Minister for approval.
5. Information for the quarterly Statistical Newsletter for the quarters ending 3/2008, 6/2008, 9/2008 and 12/2008 and half yearly report for the half year ending 6/2008 and 12/2008 with regard to National Advisory Board on Statistics was sent to C.S.O. Govt. of India, New Delhi
6. Punjab at a Glance district-wise for the year 2007 was prepared and got approved.
7. 16th Conference of Centre and State Statistical Organisations on 4-5 December, 2008 was attended by Director, Deputy Economic & Statistical Adviser and Research Officer. Action taken report of 15th Conference was also sent to CSO.
8. Regarding weekly report of important cases under rule of business 21-A and Monthly Report of Development Schemes of State Government were sent to Planning Department.
9. (i) Under Right to Information Act, 2005, information of 17 Manual updated as on 31.3.08 was prepared and placed on website [www.pbplanning .gov.in](http://www.pbplanning.gov.in)
(ii) Information of PIOs/APIOs was prepared and placed on website www.pbplanning .gov.in
(iii) Letters relating to RTI were dealt with.

Meetings

10. To review the work of E.S.O. Deputy Economic & Statistical Advisers meetings on 8.10.08, was convened. In this regard, agenda notes were prepared and minutes of the meeting were also prepared.
11. Under the Strengthening of State Statistical System, Guidelines sensitization workshop was attended on 14.1.09 for preparation of State Statistical Plan.
12. Regarding Statistical System in India 2007, information was collected from statistical departments and after compilation sent to CSO, Govt. of India.

VIII. PRICES

For studying the behavior of prices especially under inflationary pressures, wholesale and retail prices are collected every week. From these prices, monthly price bulletins are prepared. Consumer Price Index Numbers for the working class in Punjab are prepared every month for six centers viz. Abohar, Bathinda, Dhariwal, Nangal, Patiala & Phagwara and supplied to State Government departments and the concerned Industrial units for providing relief to factory workers due to increase in prices. Data regarding rural retail prices and Agriculture Labour wages are collected and circulated

or the information of Central and State Government departments every month. The monthly report of monitoring of retail & wholesale prices of selected essential commodities is prepared.

Work done during 2008-2009

1. Consumer Price Indices (Base 1987=100) for the working class for six selected centres were prepared and issued from 4/08 to 2/2009 and placed on website www.pbplanning.gov.in
2. Wholesale Price Bulletin from 1/08 to 1/2009 were prepared and placed on website www.pbplanning.gov.in
3. Statements of Agricultural Labour Wages and Rural Retail Prices from 3/08 to 1/2009 were prepared and sent to Agriculture Department Punjab.
4. The monthly monitoring report of retail & wholesale prices of selected essential commodities were prepared from 1/08 to 12/09.
5. A chapter relating to prices was prepared for Economic Survey 2008-2009.
6. A chapter of prices (containing 14 tables) was prepared for state Statistical Abstract 2008.

IX. FIELD OPERATION

The Field Operation Section of Economic & Statistical Organisation Punjab was set up with the primary objective of improving the quality of statistics at Block and Village level and also to collect additional primary data on various other important socio-economic aspects at village and block level which are rarely collected by any other agency. In the present scenario as the concept of Block/Micro level planning is gaining popularity, block level statistics have become more important. Detailed village-wise information is collected and compiled by Investigators posted at the block level then checked by Statistical Assistants/Assistant Research Officers posted at district level under the supervision of District Statistical Officers at district level is supplied to State Head Quarter where the analysis is done. On the basis of the information collected, Village Directories & Block-at-a-glance are prepared by each district of the State.

As directed by Planning Commission, Govt. of India, Village Directory of each district of the State have been placed on website since 1998-99. Block-wise indicators of Socio-Economic Development (Rural) are also prepared Annually. Critical Indicators of Punjab and All India are also prepared & placed on website. Besides these, various adhoc surveys as recommended by the State Government from time to time are conducted by this unit.

Work done during 2008-2009

1. Village Directories for the year 2006-07 of all the districts were computerized and forwarded to the office of Chief Minister for placing on the website. Village Directories for the year 2007-08 of 16 districts were received and scrutinization remained in progress.
2. Block at a Glance for the year 2007-08 was prepared and scrutiny of data remained in progress.
3. Blockwise indicators of development for the year 2007-08 of all the districts were prepared except District Faridkot and Muktsar.
4. Critical Economic Indicators of Punjab Vs India for the year 2005-06 were prepared and got computerized and placed on website www.pbplanning.gov.in.

5. Information from 22 departments/branches except education department, Punjab and State Income Section was collected and scrutinized. On the basis of which English version of overview of Economic Survey of Punjab 2008-09 was prepared and sent for approval.
6. For collection of Basic Statistics for local level development as required by Ministry of Statistics and programme Implementation for conducting Pilot Study in Roop Nagar district, Basic work of translation of Proforma/schedule and instructions into Punjabi was done
7. For tourism survey the basic work of documents was done.

X. DEMOGRAPHY & HOUSING

Demography Section prepares following reports.

1. Census of Punjab Govt. Employees & Semi- Govt. Employees.

The information regarding Govt. and Semi-Govt. employees in Punjab as on 31st March is collected every year. Annual Report contains data according to pay ranges, district-wise, department –wise, sex-wise. The information about no. of scheduled castes, backward classes, ex-servicemen, wards of freedom fighter and handicapped employees is also collected.

Since March, 1993 the information regarding semi- Govt. employees working in Boards, Corporation, Municipalities, Municipal Corporations, Market Committees, Improvement Trusts is incorporated in this publication.

2. Municipal Statistics of Punjab:

The report is published annually and contains important data of all the Municipal Corporations/ Councils of the State regarding, Vital Health, Education, Water-supply, Entertainment facilities, Hotels, Veterinary Hospitals, Banks, Roads, Sports facilities, Diesel, Petrol & Gas facilities etc. is published.

3. Building Material Prices and Wages of Labourers:

- a) Data regarding building material prices and wages of different types of labourers is collected quarterly from all the districts and after compilation it is sent to National Building organisation, Govt. of India, New Delhi.
- b) Building Construction Cost Index is prepared annually & sent to NBO, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

4. Housing /Building Construction Statistics

Information regarding Private /Public sector housing/building construction is collected from concerned Municipal Committees and concerned State Govt. Undertakings respectively & sent to N.B.O. Govt. of India, New Delhi.

5. Population Statistics

- a) Population Statistics are being prepared as per the requirements of the other departments of the State.
- b) Whenever new districts and tehsils are created, the area and population are compiled according to the new boundaries of the districts.
- c) Data is updated according to the population census.

Work done during 2008-2009

1. Census of Punjab Govt. & Semi-Govt. Employees Report as on 31.3.2007 was prepared and after

approval placed on website www.pbplanning.gov.in. Information of Punjab Govt. & Semi-Govt. Employees as on 31.3.2008 was collected from 170 offices /boards/corporations situated at Chandigarh and 20 districts and data was scrutinized. Compilation of data remained under process.

2. Municipal Year Book for the year 2006-07 was prepared and after approval was placed on website. Information regarding Municipal Year Book for 2007-08 from 17 districts of the State was received. The information of 2 districts was computerized.
3. Information regarding prices of Building Material and Wages of Labour was prepared and sent to N.B.O. Govt. of India, New Delhi.
4. Information regarding private /Public sector housing/building construction was collected from concerned Municipal Committees and concerned State Govt. Undertakings respectively & sent to N.B.O. Govt. of India, New Delhi.

XI. IRRIGATION & POWER

1. This section prepare report on Energy Statistics of Punjab which contains district wise and state-wise information pertaining to various aspects of energy is disseminated. It contains comprehensive information regarding generation and consumption of electricity, transmission and distribution, Installed capacity of plants, Plant load factors, Connected load, Length of LT, 11KV Lines and HT lines, number of transformers, towns and villages electrified, number of gas connections, number of go-bar gas plants, consumption of petrol, high speed diesel, kerosene oil and Expenditure on power schemes etc. Comparative figures for other states on different aspects are also given where ever possible.

Work done during 2008-2009

1. The report for the year 2005-06 was sent to press for printing after approval and the report for the year 2006-07 was prepared.
2. Information received for 35 tables of the report for 2007-08 was scrutinized.

MISC.

1. Fifteen (15) Tables pertaining to Energy Chapter for State Statistical Abstract 2008 and Nine(9) Tables for Economic Survey 2008-09 alongwith chapter were prepared.
2. Critical Economic Indicators regarding Energy for the year 2005-06 were prepared.

XII. FARM ACCOUNTS

Farm Accounts Section prepares following two reports annually.

- i) Farm Accounts of Selected Cultivators.
- ii) Family Budget of Selected Cultivators.

Work done during 2008-2009

1. Report of Farm Accounts in Punjab 2006-07 was prepared and report of 2007-08 was computerized after its preparation.
2. Report of Family Budget of Selected Cultivators 2006-07 was prepared and computerized.

XIII. NATIONAL SAMPLE SURVEY

The National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) was started by Govt. of India in 1950, to collect comprehensive socio-economic data relating to different sectors on National Basis required by Central and State Govts., Planning commission and other interested organisations. The National Sample Survey (NSS) is a large scale survey conducted at National level by Govt. of India in the form of successive rounds, each round covering topics of current interest. The Punjab State joined this scheme on equal matching basis during 14th round in the year 1958-59. The objective of collection of data through NSS scheme is first to obtain exclusive sample results for the State of Punjab for its onward transmission to NSSO (Govt. of India) for pooling of Central and State sample results and secondly to provide statistical information to various Government departments as and when required by them.

Work done during 2008-2009

During this period field work regarding 4th sub/round of 64th Round of NSS was started from April, 2008 to June, 2008. Total 80 samples (R-44, U-36) were surveyed and approximately 1760 schedules were filled. A Training workshop for the 65th round of NSS was attended by the JD, R.O., A.R.O. at Regional Office of NSSO (G.O.I.) at Ludhiana. On the basis of instructions/guidelines issued in Training Workshop at Ludhiana, a training workshop was organized for the different circles of the State Head Office, Chandigarh in the month of July, 2008.

Field survey work of 65th round of NSS was started. A number of 216 (96 urban and 120 rural) samples were completed on 31st March, 2009. Approximately 5184 schedules were filled. Field survey work was also checked by the officers/supervisors from Head Office in the field from time to time and needful guidance was given to the field staff about survey work as and when required by them.

XIV. TABULATION

Tabulation section tabulates the data of National Sample Survey (State Sample) collected from the field under various rounds. Processing and tabulation of data is done in accordance with the procedure and tabulation plan supplied by the National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) Govt. of India, New Delhi.

Work done during 2008-2009

- (a) Data entry was done for 63 Samples of 64th round of NSS regarding the Schedule 0.0-list of Households, schedule 10.2 employment and un-employment and migration particulars, 1.0-Consumer expenditure and schedule 25.2 participation and expenditure in education.
- (b) 83 Samples of 64th round of NSS were scrutinized. The work of validation in respect of 63rd round of 75 Samples has been done.

XV. TRAINING

The Training Cell was set up in Economic and Statistical Organisation, Punjab in 1980 on the recommendations of third Conference of Central and State Statistical Organisation held in February, 1977. The main objective of the training cell is to make the statistical personnel conversant

with the concepts, definitions and terminology of the subjects like Elementary Statistics, Economics and Mathematics used in the field of statistics.

Work done during 2008-2009

During this period 74th batch of training was conducted especially for the newly recruited Investigators in E.S.O from 14.7.2008 to 25.7.2008.

XVI. ART

Main function of the section is to prepare titles, graphical charts/pictogrammes, maps and other visual aids for various publications/reports/folders and brochures of Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab.

During the year 2008-09, 55 black and white charts for printing in publications, 9 black and white title designs including their colour schemes for the publications, 6 multi coloured displaying charts were prepared as per requirement of department.

XVII. HUMAN DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH & CO-ORDINATION.

Human Development Report of Punjab had been released in November, 2004.

1. Follow up Action:

Concerned Departments were asked to implement actionable points of the report.. Most of the departments had taken appropriate and suitable action on these points.

2. Strengthening of State Plans for Human Development:

Revised work plan of Rs. 183 lakhs was sent to Planning Commission, Govt. of India, New Delhi for approval and the same was approved by the Planning Commission. In this regard, PCA has been signed between Planning Commission, Govt. of India, New Delhi and Secretary Planning on behalf of Govt. of Punjab.

3. Livelihood Study:

M/S WAPCOS Ltd., Gurgaon submitted the draft Final report and the same has been thoroughly reviewed and was discussed at length in the State Level consultation workshop organized on 27.1.2009. The consultant agency has been directed to submit the revised final report by 31.3.2009.

4. Three Thematic Studies.

Three studies i.e. (I) Gender Empowerment and Declining Sex Ratio in Punjab (II) Problems of migrant Labourers in Punjab. (III) Drop Out Rate of School Children in Punjab, have been given to consultant agency FAITH Healthcare Pvt. Ltd. New Delhi for preparing reports on these studies.

Final reports for all the three studies have been submitted by the consultant agency. Report titled "Gender Empowerment and Declining Sex Ratio" has been formally approved by the Steering Committee in its 9th meeting held on 27.1.2009 and the same is now under process for implementation. Report on "Drop out rate of School Children in Punjab" is under review.

5. District Human Development Reports:

Two district Hoshiarpur and Sangrur of the state have been selected for preparing the District Human Development Report. Panjab University, Chandigarh and Punjabi University Patiala are

taking up this task respectively. Final Draft reports for these two DHDRS was to be submitted on or before 31.5.2009 by respective Universities.

6. Films on Human Development:

Two Documentary films have been produced under the project namely: “Sanu hi Kuch Karna Pau”- on the theme of Agriculture Diversification in Punjab and “Hope and Despair”- on the theme of Drug Abuse in Punjab. Final version of the first film has been submitted by the Film and Television Institute of India(FTII), Pune while the Rough Cut for the second film has been screened and suggestions/comments have been communicated to the FTII for necessary modifications in the final version of the film to be released by them in near future.

XVIII. ECONOMIC CENSUS

Economic Census Section was created by Govt. of India to conduct the 5th Economic Census in the State of Punjab; Economic Census is 100% centrally sponsored scheme.

During 2008-09 report on 5th Economic Census was prepared and got approved from Hon’ble Finance & Planning Minister, Punjab.

XIX. MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT LOCAL AREA DEVELOPMENT SCHEME (MPLADS)

Under this scheme, funds to the tune of Rs. 2.00 crores are allocated to Member of Parliament every year. which are released on the basis of recommendation made by the MPs and are spent on development works carried under the supervision of Deputy Commissioner in the respective areas at district level. At the State level, the Department of Planning is Nodal Agency to look after/monitor this scheme. Economic & Statistical Organisation, Punjab (E.S.O.) is performing the duty as Nodal Department under this scheme and maintaining liaison with the Deputy Commissioners at the District level and Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation Govt. of India.

Deputy Economic & Statistical Adviser are fully involved in the formulation, implementation and monitoring of progress of the district level plan schemes.
